New Series Inflation Rate for July 2013 up to 11.8%

The Consumer Price Index

The new Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in **2012**, the base year, which has an index of 100.

New Series July 2013 rate of inflation

The July 2013 year-on-year inflation rate for the new series as measured by the CPI stood at 11.8 per cent, up from the 11.6 per cent recorded in June 2013 (Table 1). The monthly change rate for July 2013 was 1.3 per cent. As indicated in Table 1, the monthly rate recorded in June 2013 was 1.5 percent.

Food and non-food inflation Groups

Table 2 shows the inflation rates for the 12 main COICOP groups. Clothing and footwear (18.1%), Miscellaneous goods and services (17.7%), Furnishing, Household Equipment, and Routine Maintenance (17.0%), and Housing, water, electricity, gas & other utilities recorded inflation of

16.6%, whilst the **Communications** subgroup had the lowest inflation rate of 1.3%.

Regional differentials

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 4.6 per cent in the Upper East Region to 15.0 per cent in the Western Region. Western, Ashanti, Eastern and Volta regions recorded inflation rate above the national average of 11.8 per cent (Table 3).

Dissemination

A bulletin on the new July 2013 CPI and more detailed data in time series have been posted the on GSS website. *www.statsghana.gov.g* The target publication date of the monthly CPI newsletter is the 15th of each month. It is released on the second Wednesday of each month, and on the third, when the 15th of the month fall on Wednesday. The next release date is 11th of September, 2013.
